As usual here are a few tips for things to do in your garden in February. In last month's magazine I included a tip of knocking the snow off conifer branches to stop them bending out of shape. Since this winter is proving rather chilly it's worth including it again but also adding that grasses may need protection. Some people leave them for the frosted effects rather than cutting them back however you can tie them up with string to help mitigate snow damage. Other things to be getting on with are the pruning of apple and pear trees. Cut back winter flowering Jasmine they get rather straggly and benefit from this as they will flower on new growth through the year ahead. Check your hanging baskets and water if dry they will start to pick up on milder days and so dead head the pansies to encourage more flowers. Order snowdrops now and split clumps in your garden to make more clumps. Snowdrops are the one bulb you need to buy with leaves on rather than in packets hanging on garden centre hooks!
